



Articulation of Transfer Agreement

Interdisciplinary Studies

Lee University and Cleveland State Community College hereby enter into a partnership that promotes academic opportunity through this program articulation agreement. This agreement between Lee University and Cleveland State Community College is to be periodically reviewed, and revised, if necessary, by the partner institutions.

Any student entering Lee University for the first time in Fall 2009 or later is eligible to be considered for the A.A./A.S. Transfer Agreement. Under this agreement, any student who has completed an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree from an accredited post-secondary institution will be considered to have met all general education requirements at Lee University, with the following exceptions:

1. Students will be required to take one religion course each semester for up to 4 semesters. [The student teaching semester for education majors will be excluded.] This includes the capstone course which is offered within the discipline.
2. Students will be required to complete 10 clock hours of service for each non-summer semester they are enrolled at Lee up to 40 hours.
3. Students will be required to complete LEEU-102A Global Perspectives Seminar, LEEU-102B Foundations of Benevolence, and either GNST-251/2/3 (a study abroad experience offered through Lee) or GNST-250 (an individually arranged and approved experience).
4. Students will be required to complete any pre-requisites for upper-division courses.
5. Students enrolled in Bachelor of Arts (.BA) academic programs will be required to complete the Foreign Language requirement of two semesters at the intermediate level or higher. The intermediate level is the 200-level for French, Spanish and American Sign Language, and the 300-level for Greek and Hebrew.
6. Students enrolled in teacher licensure programs (.BST, .BAT, .BME) will be required to complete all courses necessary to meet state licensure standards, even if some of those courses are general education requirements that would otherwise be waived for students in non-licensure degree programs who have completed an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree. This

waiving of general education course requirements does not apply to students who have been awarded the Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree.

No transfer credit will be accepted without official transcripts. Transfer students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (C) or higher. Transfer courses must not duplicate other courses for which credit has been awarded. Developmental or pre-college courses are not accepted for transfer.


The following course equivalencies apply to the transfer articulation. These equivalencies may be updated, as required, upon the formal approval of the Vice Presidents of Academic Affairs of both Lee University and Cleveland State Community College.
