Associate/Bachelor's Articulation Policies

This program articulation agreement between Cleveland State Community College (CSCC) and SAU will lead to the awarding of both the associate and bachelor's degrees if the student successfully completes all the courses outlined in the agreement and satisfies all other academic regulations and graduation requirements. Transfer students to SAU will not be expected to satisfy any additional (or fewer) requirements that non-transfer (native) SAU students.

1. Students may choose to follow any articulation agreement in effect while they are enrolled at CSCC, provided they graduate from CSCC no later than five years and from SAU no later than 10 years after the Fall semester of the academic year indicated on the agreement. However, transfer students will be required to comply with any catalog changes affecting any academic policies or degree program changes that are required of non-transfer SAU students.
2. This articulation agreement assumes that all courses used to satisfy requirements listed in the Freshmen and Sophomore years will be completed in residence at CSCC with a minimum grade of a "C". Students who transfer credits to CSCC from other schools may use the articulation agreements as advising guides; however, non-CSCC credits must be independently evaluated by SAU to determine transferability.
3. Students who transfer to SAU from two-year institutions must have a minimum composite score of 18 on the Enhanced American College Test (ACT) or a minimum of 710 on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 (on a 4.00 scale).
4. Students who transfer to the SAU Social Work Program must complete the Social Work Program admission process and meet the following minimum standards:
  - a. A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.50 on a 4.00 scale.
  - b. Completion of 60 or more hours of academic credit to be considered a junior in academic standing.
  - c. No incomplete grades in any Human Services courses or other pre-requisite courses.
  - d. A grade of a "C" or better in SOWK 1050 and BIOL 1020/1021 and passing grades in all pre-requisite courses.
  - e. Completion of the Social Welfare Competency Exam with a passing score of 70% or higher.
  - f. Completion of the formal Social Work Program application requirements including a face-to-face interview with the social work faculty.
5. The final 30 semester hours must be completed in residence at SAU.
6. At least 40 hours of the 124 hours required for graduation must be taken at the 300 level or above.
7. Transfer students to SAU must meet the admission and continuation standards as outlined in the SAU catalog at the time of transfer.
8. The awarding or use of any non-traditional credit (e.g. CLEP, AP, IEP, credit by exam, military services, etc.) must be approved by the degree-granting institutions.
9. In addition to the specific requirements for a bachelor's degree, all transfer students must satisfy any specific program, major or degree requirement or academic regulation that might be required for entrance to or continuation in a specific program, as well as all of the University's requirements for graduation.
10. The agreement outlined above does not supersede the requirements approved by the faculty of SAU.
