Young Americans National Music Outreach Tour - Cleveland State Community College will host the Young Americans National Music Outreach Tour on Saturday, Jan. 31 at Cleveland Middle School. All students in the CSCC service area (grades 4-college) are invited to participate in this event. The workshop begins at 4 p.m. on Thursday, Jan. 29, runs all day on the 30th and the final event is a concert featuring area students and the Young Americans cast at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 31.

The focus of this tour is a three-day workshop with 40 teachers in music, dance, drama, and performance. The workshop is designed to work with the students on different levels. The cost is \$47 per student for the three days. The cost to attend the concert is \$8 for adults and \$5 for students.

The primary goals of the Young Americans are to encourage music in our nation's schools, to train young people in performance and to strengthen character. The total program will include young people learning, growing, respecting each other's strengths, having fun and discovering their own potential through the common denominators of music and performance. Students will participate in vocal ensembles, staging, choreography, developing performance attitudes, vocal techniques, dance, musical theater, and sound techniques. Instrumentalists are also incorporated into the program, as well as singers and actors.
