Diversity Grant Program

The purpose of the Access and Diversity Grant Program is to enhance the rate of participation in higher education by a diverse population of students. Students who successfully complete two semesters on the Access and Diversity Grant program will receive the grant for three additional semesters. **TO QUALIFY FOR A RENEWAL**, you must reapply for the grant by completing a renewal application and meeting all eligibility requirements.

Grant Eligibility

- Students must maintain a semester and cumulative GPA of 2.5 if the grant is to be renewed.
- Students must successfully complete 75% of attempted credit hours.
- Funds are available for part-time students, but priority consideration will be given to students who enroll at Cleveland State for 12 hours or more per semester.
- Grants are available and renewable for a maximum of five semesters. Students must apply for renewal each academic year.
