History of the Nursing Program

Cleveland State Community College

Cleveland State Community College (CSCC) is one of the oldest community colleges in the state of Tennessee. In fact, CSCC was the first community college founded in the eastern section of the state and began offering classes in the fall of 1967. The school administrators quickly saw the need for a nursing department to address the changing local healthcare needs and national trends in nursing at that time. The program was founded on the belief that nursing is a service, which aims to assist individuals to attain, maintain, or regain optimum level wellness through application of the nursing process. In January of 1968, the first nursing class began their intense and concentrated program. In May of 1969, twenty-one CSCC nursing students became the first to graduate with an Associate of Science in Nursing (A.S.N.) degree.

Through the years, the CSCC Nursing Department has always tried to accommodate the needs of its students. Many of these students have jobs, families, and many other obligations in addition to school. The recent addition of evening classes has allowed a greater number of students to pursue a career in the field of nursing while still balancing their busy lives outside of class. The nursing program at Cleveland State is significant because it allows individuals an opportunity to better themselves professionally, and also is a step towards alleviating a national shortage in the nursing profession at a time when we need it the most.

Cleveland State Community College Department of Nursing is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) and approved by the Tennessee Board of Nursing. The Nursing Department maintains a contractual relationship with many clinical and health care agencies throughout East Tennessee and North Georgia. The program prepares graduates to be professionals practicing nursing in a competent and conscientious manner. Our nursing students are accountable for upholding high moral and ethical standards; this personal responsibility is vital to nursing.

Since the inception of the Nursing Department, CSCC has graduated over 2000 successful nurses, who are working in all areas of nursing all over the country and abroad in a wide variety of settings. Among our distinguished graduates, many have become leaders in a variety of fields. We are proud of who we are, where we came from, and where we are going from here. The sky's the limit.
